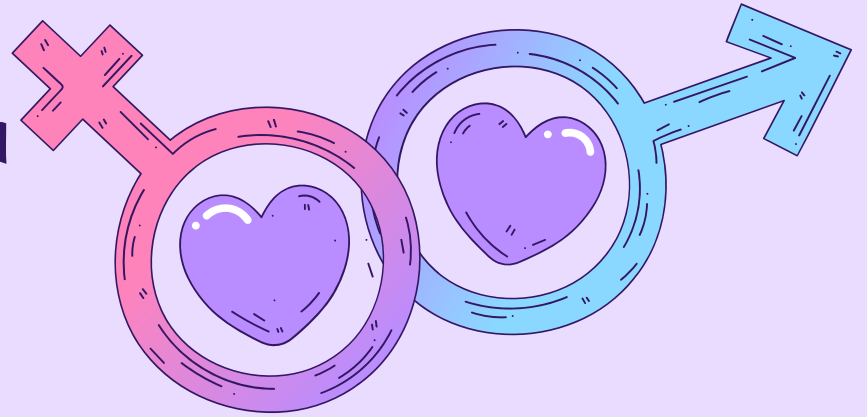

Project Vision and Proposal

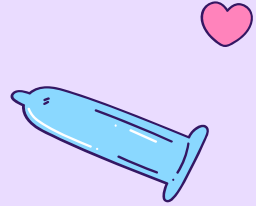
Initial Goals:

- **Partner with Planned Parenthood to answer our driving question.**

How Can We Protect the Students from teen pregnancy and provide resources to help educate and improve the sexual health education here at KCS?


Sex Health Info
A booth in the KCS bathrooms and provides condoms, and other available contraceptives. We will provide information through pamphlets regarding birth control, STD, abortions, and creating healthy sexual relationships.

Parenthood is the leading reason teen girls drop out of school

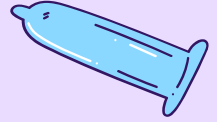
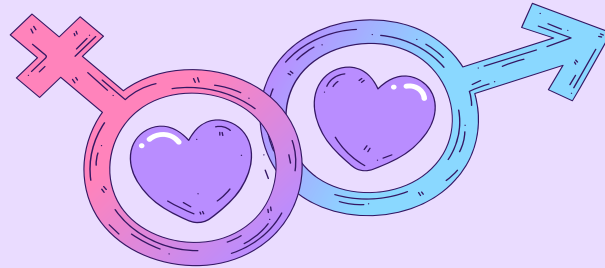
Possible Mentors:

1 in 4 teens contract a STD every year



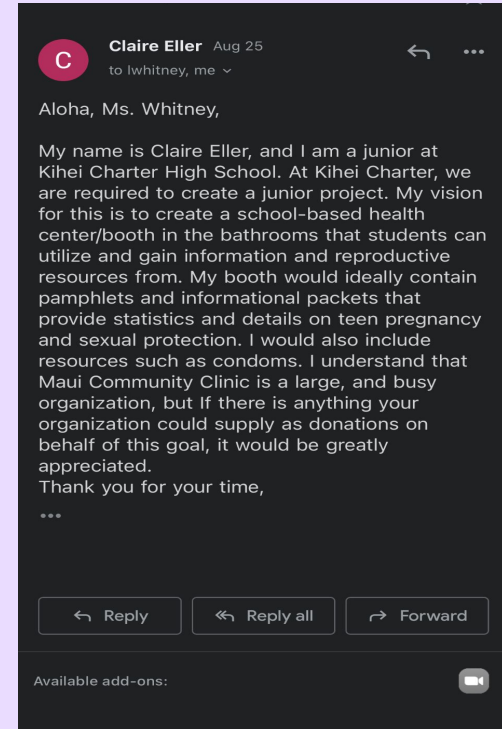
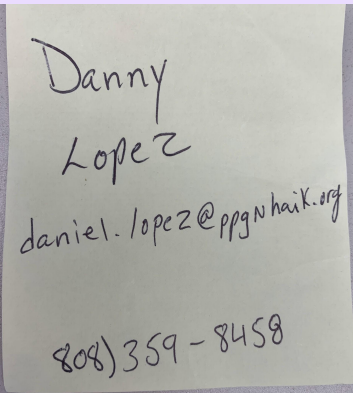
Answer to Our Driving Question:

To protect the students and KCS from teen pregnancy and educate the students on sexual health, we can supply a consistent source of condoms and educational pamphlets that can be taken anonymously from a safe space in the school.



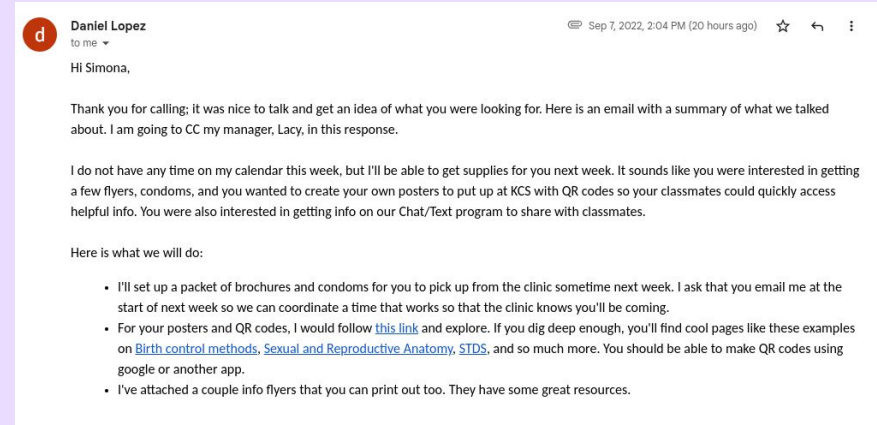
Product Process—Beginning

- Met with mentor Nancy Rodriguez with school based health alliance.
- We visited Planned Parenthood in Kahului, and talked to them about supporting our project, and providing donations.
- Called and emailed organizations in the community.



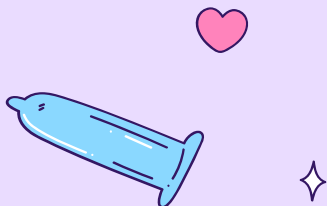
Beginning pt 2

- Visited Planned Parenthood to pick up resources.
- Started research for creating our own pamphlets, gathered notes on sexual health and wellness information.
- Researched the necessity of condoms in schools



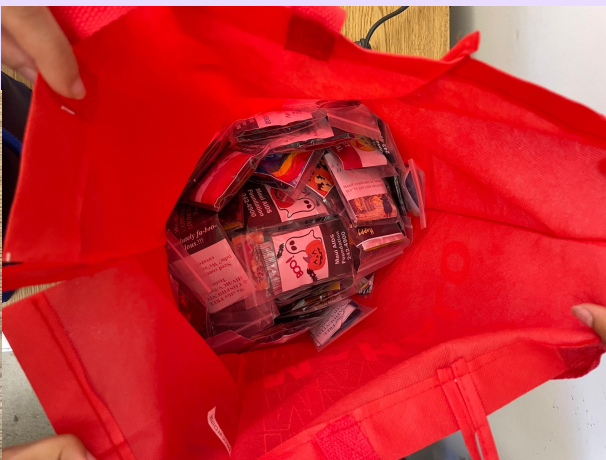
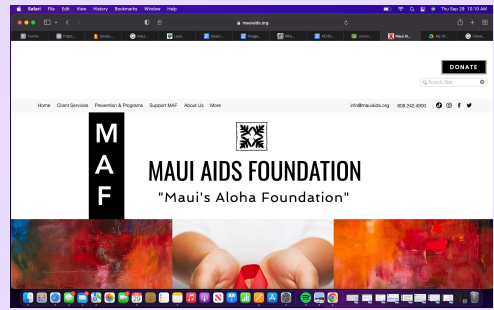
Necessity for Condoms in High Schools

- ★ There are 750,000 pregnancies per year
- ★ The leading reason of girls dropping out of high school is from teenage pregnancy
- ★ 1 in 4 teens contract an STD from the ages of 14 to 18 years of age
- ★ 3 in 10 American girls will become pregnant before the age of 20



Product Process—Middle

- Reached out to multiple organizations for donations.
- Emailed with Maui Aids foundation for them to drop off resources.
- Received Resources from Maui Aids Foundation at KCS.



Product Process—Middle pt 2

- **Discussed table or display options with Ms. Federoff who turned our project down and created a major setback.**
- **Met with counselors to give condoms out in their offices.**
- **Created, printed out, and posted flyers around the school to inform students of the available condoms at the counselors offices.**
- **Distributed pamphlets and posters in restrooms, and classrooms**

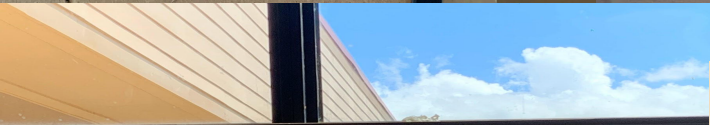

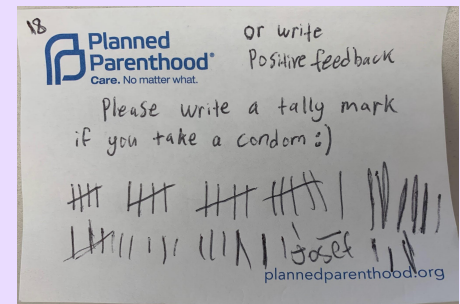
Product Process—End

72 condoms taken from the booth, 10 pamphlets were taken

55 condoms was supplied to the counselors and we gave 32 more on Dec. 1

Positive feedback was received on post-it notes as well in person

- ★ Create booth in Ms. Cassie's room
- ★ Posted flyers about booth in Ms. Cassie's
- ★ Started to collect information on amount of condom packets taken
- ★ Refilled counselor's supply and booths weekly



Final Product

Our final product is our sexual health booth located in Ms. Cassie's room.

The pressure of the small amount of time we had and the amount of workload from other classes stretched us thin but thankfully we completed a final product.
